

How to add Facebook Conversion Pixel Tracking

3. Locate the "FB Pixel Event" extension from the templates list.
4. Click on the "Install" button to initiate the installation process.

Step 2: Configuring the FB Pixel Event Extension

1. After installing the extension, you'll see a page asking for Pixel ID and Event name.
2. In the provided field, enter your Facebook Pixel ID obtained in the prerequisites section.
3. Specify the event name relevant to the action or interaction you want to track.
4. Save the configuration settings by clicking "Install".

Install Custom JS Template

Step 3: Checking the configuration.

1. Navigate to the Custom JavaScript page from the top right dropdown menu.
2. Locate the section of code related to the event you configured in Step 2. You can easily find it by searching for "Custom JS Template #34".
3. Ensure that the code snippet provided by the FB Pixel Event extension is present in the template.
4. Click Save and Publish LIVE to ensure your changes go live.

Step 4: Testing and Verifying the Integration

1. Visit the relevant page on your website where the Digioh campaign is deployed.

2. Perform the action or interaction that triggers the event you set up.
3. Access the Events Manager within your Facebook Ads account.
4. Verify that the event is being tracked by checking for activity related to the event name you specified.
5. If the event appears in the Events Manager, the integration is successful.

Alternatively, the [Meta Pixel Helper](#) Chrome extension can help you verify the events that are firing.
