

Fix Text Appearing on 2 Lines / Font Wider in Safari

Since every browser is different, what looks good in the editor may render a little differently on other devices. It's not uncommon for fonts to look fine in Chrome on your Windows PC, but have completely different spacing and sizing on a mobile device. Sometimes the font spacing will appear wider and look strange, or even cause the text to appear on the next line.


If your text appears on a second line in some browsers, try these tips below.

What you'll learn


- Fix text wrapping issues
- Optimize spacing for buttons

Here are some things to try:


1. Increase Bounding Box Dimensions First, check your bounding box (element wrapper) dimensions. If another browser renders the font slightly wider than the editor, text may appear on a second line. To solve this, make the bounding box wider and taller than your text.




**"TIGHT" BOUNDING BOX

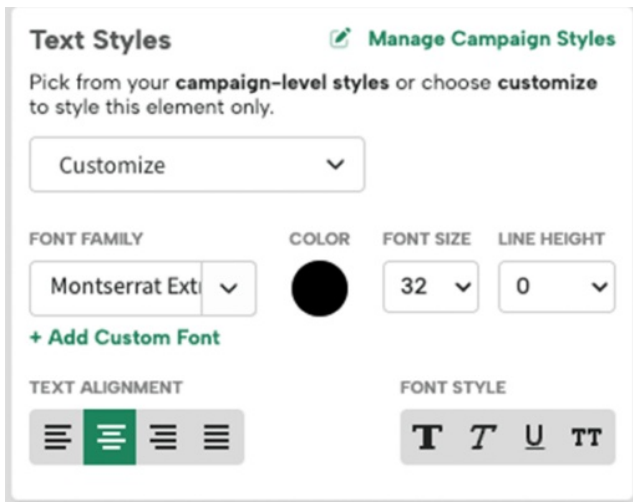


**BOUNDING BOX WITH

2. Reduce Font Size If stretching the bounding box doesn't help, try making your font size a little smaller, if possible.

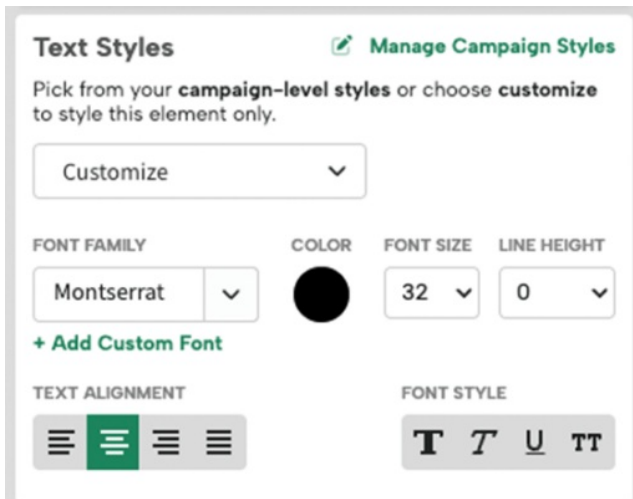

3. Change Font Weight

Some browsers can render bolded fonts differently and will increase the letter spacing on bold fonts. Try setting the font weight to normal instead.

3. Use Correct Custom Font Family (not the Bold button)

This is very common when using the **Bold** button under Font Style on a **Custom Font**. Fonts uploaded to Digioh are usually created per font weight, where Regular and Bold are separate font families. If you use the Bold button on a Regular custom font, browsers will try to bold it, but they all have different methods. This can lead to text wrapping on certain devices but not others. Instead, use the Bold version of the font family and leave the Bold button unchecked.

Buttons

These tips also apply to buttons. If your button text appears on 2 lines, try making the button wider or changing the font size and weight.
